Will of  
Christopher Magle, deceased  
Letter Testamentary granted to  
Christopher Magle by the Court  
and John Robert Boswell Esq: witness  
therin named, being first  
July 23<sup>rd</sup> 1792.

In the Name of God Amen of Christoffer Nagle of the Township  
of Middelburg and County of Bucks and State of Pennsylvania yeoman  
being now in body both of sound and Perfect Memory blessed be  
Almighty God for the same do make and publish this my last  
Will and Testament in Manner and forme following that is to say  
first I will and Ordain that all my just debts and funeral charges shall  
be paid of by My hereafter named Executors

2nd item I give and devise unto my son Christoffer Nagle and to  
his Heirs and Assigns All that My Marriage Settlement tract  
of Land situated in the Place aforesaid as in a deed under my  
hand & Seal bearing Even date herewith will appear

3rd item I will that my said son Christoffer Shall Pay unto my here-  
after named Children as follows to wit unto my Daughter Elizabeth  
Catherina One year after my death the sum of Twenty Five Pounds  
and so on yearly Twenty Five Pounds the second payment  
to Margaret the third unto my Son George Nagle the fourth  
unto my Daughter Eva and the fifth unto my Daughter  
Maria Catherina the sixth unto my Daughter Maria  
Elizabeth Twenty five Pounds unto my said Son of Give and —  
Bequeath also the sum of twenty five Pounds and in  
the Eight year of my life unto my Daughter also Twenty  
five Pounds Money if for all them sums of Money heretofore  
bequeathed to the said my Son have all ready signed sealed  
and delivered bonds to one by Executing the Deed to him  
for the aforesaid Premises to him devised

4th item My said Son Christoffer shall give and provide for me all and

during Life Sufficient Mead drink apparel Laundry  
and Washing fitting for an old Christian and good  
attended in Weak and Sick Times

fiffty - I will that No charge shall be made for any Montmorony  
Except Cloath Goods is to be charged to my Estate

sixty I will that all this Personality Estate shall be distributed  
amongst my Children in these parts Maria & Anne and Share alio's  
allowing to my Son George One Spanish Milord Deller for  
his first Child Right and the more

Seventy I do hereby appoint Christopher Nagle my forenamed Son of John  
Edward Esq: Executors of this my Last will and Testament to  
do hereby null and void all former Wills by me made in  
Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal  
the twenty second day of May in the year of Our Lord One  
Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety two
