do exhibit or cause to be exhibited to the County Court, where orders for administrations passed,

within ninety days after the date of these presents: and the same goods, chattels and credits,

and all other the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased at the time of his death, or

which at any time after shall come to the hands or possession of the said

Charles H. H. H. or into the hands or possession of any other

person or persons for him, do well and truly administer according to law. And further do make
